

POSITION: Child and Youth Social Worker – Permanent, Part Time 0.4 FTE

(2 days/week)

Position Summary:

The Child and Youth Social Worker will uphold the Mission and Vision of the North York Family Health Team by providing patient-centered services to children, youth and families/ caregivers within an interdisciplinary environment.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Provide assessment, counseling, support and referral services to children/youth (Aged 0-20) and extended families/caregivers for a broad range of services dependent on needs, including parenting support services
- Provide resources including programs and workshops for children, youth and families/caregivers
- Present complex cases/case conferences to the mental health interdisciplinary team for peer support and learning.
- Maintain accurate and timely documentation
- Support families in navigating systems
- Parenting support
- Provide feedback to parents to support the children and youth

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Masters of Social Work degree from an accredited Social Work program is required
- Registered Social Worker (RSW) in good standing with the Ontario College of Social Workers and Social Service Workers (OCSWSSW)
- 3+ years of clinical experience working with children, youth and families in mental health, utilizing current knowledge of accepted practices and legislation
- Knowledge of Child Family Services Act and Child Welfare services
- Formal training and demonstrated knowledge of evidence-based treatment models in working with children, youth and families/caregivers i.e. attachment, play based or play therapy, cognitive behavioral therapy, mindfulness, etc.
- Strong skills in advocacy, clinical assessment, individual/family counseling and treatment
- Experience in the coordination of services, care planning, monitoring and evaluation of ongoing care
- Knowledge and training in trauma informed care and solution focused short-term interventions including single session brief therapy

- Excellent interpersonal, verbal and written communication skills
- Ability to demonstrate brief counselling skills and knowledge of community mental health centers and resources for children, youth and families
- Self-motivated and works well independently and within a multidisciplinary team
- Demonstrates computer literacy including EMRs (Accuro/PSS) an asset for clients/patient's files and documents
- Provide a Vulnerable Sector Screening (VSS) check from the Toronto Police Services
